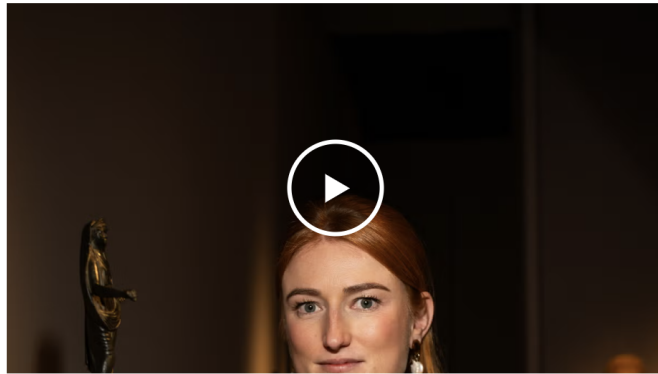


Don't Miss These 9 Promising Young Women at TEFAF

Founded in 1971, this gallery focuses on art from these eras and early European art. Tyndall can also provide advice to budding collectors. And always ask yourself, if money were no object, would this still be the piece you would go for?'

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
